Aaron will demonstrate ways YOU can create defensible space around YOUR home and minimize a fire starting or moving over YOUR property. There are simple techniques such as:

- Cleaning your gutters of pine needles,
- Placing woodpiles away from your house,
- Using high-rated fire-retardant shingles,
- Cutting lower branches off “ladder fuel” trees, and
- Removing wood and duff from the ground.

Aaron will demonstrate **more** that you can do to *protect YOU and YOUR family*. Aaron will share his expertise and **answer specific questions you have** about how YOU can best protect YOUR property from a fire in the Floyd Hill area.

Floyd Hill is one of the 3 most **EXTREME HAZZARD FIRE areas** in the Evergreen and Clear Creek Fire Districts.

Be proactive against fires started from lightening strikes, house fires, or man-initiated fires. *If every neighbor does their part, firefighters can better **protect YOUR FAMILY, YOUR HOME, and YOUR PROPERTY** from a fire’s deadly destruction.*
